Foreword from our President

Dear Friends,

Once again, there were many crises in 2023, and once again, Bibliothèques Sans Frontières staff adapted to new contexts and provided assistance to the most vulnerable people around the world.

In Türkiye and Morocco, after the deadly earthquakes, in Ukraine, alongside those affected by the war, but also in Afghanistan, Niger and the Democratic Republic of Congo, **we took action to ensure that every child, woman and man could continue to have access to culture, education, and information.**

Every programme we run in these particularly demanding contexts reinforces the conviction that we have had for 16 years: **access to knowledge in all its forms is a unique way of encouraging resistance, emancipation, resilience and peace.** The difference between life and survival is reflected in the capacity of each human being to cultivate themselves.

Despite growing political instability, this year we also opened our second regional hub in West Africa, with an ambitious project involving our offline internet technology for the Senegalese Ministry of Education. In Ivory Coast, fifteen Ideas Box will soon be available to provide young people with careers' guidance in employment agencies.

And in France, where we continue to implement a quarter of our activities, **the role of access to knowledge in the struggle against economic, social, educational and territorial inequality** is as relevant as

ever. This is why we have made media and information literacy a priority, training and equipping those involved in the culture, education and mediation sectors.


Our flagship programmes to promote reading for all have also continued to develop with, for example, the opening this year of our first micro-libraries - 'microbiblis' - in the French overseas territories!

2023 was also the tenth anniversary of the French version of Khan Academy, which we adapted. This fun-to-use, free American platform gives French-speaking teachers, pupils, educators and parents access to thousands of lessons and exercises in science and mathematics. **So that success is within everyone's reach!**

In the same spirit, given the growing use of artificial intelligence in education, BSF has positioned itself in favour of inclusive and frugal innovation, because, as Aristotle said, 'Progress is only worthwhile if it is shared by all'.

We can be proud of these achievements. They are the result of our collaborators' unflinching commitment on the five continents, as well as that of the volunteers, friends and partners who trust and support us day in and day out. Our warm thanks to them all.

We may not be able to stop wars, but together **we can prepare for peace.** Bibliothèques Sans Frontières will always be present on the ground to do our part.

About us


Bibliothèques Sans Frontières has been promoting universal access to knowledge since 2007.

Our innovative projects promote culture, education and information as **vectors of resistance, resilience and emancipation**. Thanks to our innovative tools, our thousands of resources in 27 languages and our expertise in mediation, we work with people in crisis and development contexts, and in situations where there are major inequalities, in 22 countries, including France.

We provide our expertise in a wide range of areas, including:



Through our work, we contribute to achieve eight of the seventeen Sustainable Development Goals established by the United Nations.



INNOVATIVE TOOLS


We design innovative tools that can be used by people even in the most complex environments. We use technology and design to increase their social impact by breaking down the physical and economic barriers that limit access to knowledge.

We campaign for frugal and inclusive innovation that leaves no one by the wayside.

We also give priority to 'open source' solutions so that anyone can contribute to them and help to build an open and inclusive knowledge-based society.

We place beneficiaries' needs at the centre of our project designs.

From the initial assessment to the impact assessment, via decisions about library content, co-building and iteration with the field are central to our approach.



TAILORED CONTENTS

We continue to update a library of 60 000 physical and digital resources in 27 languages to meet the needs of the people we support, depending on the context and our partners' objectives.



TRAINED MEDIATORS

We identify and train 'information champions'. We help librarians, educators and facilitators to use our tools and resources so that they can continue to implement our projects autonomously in the long term.

We are convinced that it is not enough to share our resources, and that it is also necessary to know how to use them. That is why, in addition to access, the issue of accessibility is central in our projects.

By training mediators, who then, in turn, will be able to transmit their knowledge to others, we feed into a virtuous circle that gets richer and stronger.

What we do

Bibliothèques Sans Frontières creates tools, applications and digital platforms that make knowledge available to those who do not normally have access to it.

THE IDEAS BOX

Designed by Philippe Starck for BSF in 2014, the Ideas Box is a mobile 'pop up' multimedia library. It can be set up in twenty minutes, creating a colorful, welcoming and safe space of approximately 100 m², with, of course, books, but also games, computers and tablets, creative equipment, and a 'cinema'. The content of each Ideas Box is unique as it is adapted to the needs of the beneficiaries, depending on their age, language, disabilities, etc., and the objectives of our operational partners.



THE IDEAS CUBE

The Ideas Cube is a small computer server that contains a digital multimedia library. Once it is set up, it provides access to thousands of resources and training courses from the BSF catalogue, without needing an internet connection.

KAJOU CARDS


BSF's social enterprise, Kajou, has created microSD cards containing educational content which can be directly inserted into mobile phones to transform them into thematic libraries without the need for an internet connection and without using mobile data.

KARIBU

Created by BSF in 2022, initially for Ukrainian refugees, Karibu is a free smartphone application to help people learn French quickly and autonomously with explanations in Arabic, Pashto or Ukrainian. Having been developed with teachers, it helps users to communicate on everyday subjects (administrative procedures, finding a job, etc.) and introduces them to French culture. Its unique approach, with explanations in the learner's native language, make it a simple tool to use which complements face-to-face French classes.





BOOKS COLLECTION MISSION

Every year, BSF collects 800 000 books from cultural institutions, book industry, companies and the general public in France. These books are then sorted by volunteers and staff at BSF's social enterprise, Solibri, within the collection centre near Paris.

3 QUESTIONS TO

Julien Morali
BSF Tools and Digital Services Director

Given that a third of the world's population doesn't have access to the internet, what is BSF doing to reach these people?

"The fact that there is little access to the internet in certain remote regions inevitably creates a digital divide that hinders economic and social development, and limits access to education. BSF's Research and Development department develops technological solutions to share educational and cultural resources with the people living in areas where there is little or no access to internet".

What were the biggest projects for the Digital Services department in 2023?

"With support from ShareIT, our staff worked on the redesign of our Off-Line Internet Platform (OLIP). This platform, which was created by BSF, allows users of our tools to gain access to thousands of digital resources via the browser on their smartphone, tablet or computer, thanks to the lightweight web server (Raspberry Pi) used to deliver the resources. In parallel, we also made changes to the ergonomics of the Ideas Cube to make it more robust and easy to use, while enhancing its performance in terms of battery life, management of simultaneous connections and technical stability".

What are the prospects for the coming years?

"From now till 2030, our work will be focused on three main objectives:

- We will continue to develop the Off-Line Internet Platform, particularly on the Ideas Cube server, so that it can be independent of the related technical solution - so that any device used by the general public can be transformed into a lightweight server, whether it's a phone, a tablet or a laptop, for example.
- We also want to make our catalogue of resources, which is currently limited to our partners, open to all, so that everyone can add new resources and contribute to sharing knowledge widely.
- And with the opening of new operational offices in the world, we need to help make our colleagues in the field as autonomous as possible, so we are working on new tools to support them".

Viewing artificial intelligence as an opportunity!

Convinced that the artificial intelligence revolution could allow more equitable access to knowledge throughout the world, BSF is collaborating with a consortium of experts to design ethical solutions that meet the learning and training needs of our beneficiaries.



The BSF network

BSF International has a number of 'sister' organisations who help us to promote universal access to knowledge, based on the specific situation in their countries.

BSF Belgique : learning about and using digital technology



Since 2017 in Belgium, our staff have focused their efforts on reducing educational and social inequality and the digital divide. They have created innovative educational resources and have provided tailor-made training courses for teachers, mediators and citizens in connection with different programmes.

- ▶ 'Les Cyber Héros': training courses for parents and teachers, events for children, and educational resources to tackle issues to do with digital citizenship in an informal manner: online security, cyber-bullying, etc.
- ▶ 'Khan Academy': translation and adaptation to the Belgian context, training and promotion of the platform among teachers and their pupils.
- ▶ 'Les Questionnautes' : activities and a light-hearted educational web series on science to stimulate the curiosity of young people and inspire them to go further.

LWB US: promoting access to information




Since 2014, Bibliothèques Sans Frontières US has set up programmes in several states to provide disadvantaged communities with innovative educational resources. In 2023, it specifically focused on:

- ▶ Providing public libraries with support to ensure that inhabitants, and particularly those in isolated areas, had sustainable access to essential resources and information.
- ▶ Improving access to information about mental healthcare among the black community in Baltimore by distributing educational resources in hairdressers and beauty parlours.
- ▶ Working with communities in Loiza, Puerto Rico, to enable the documentation, preservation and transmission of their cultural heritage.

BSF Italia: helping to integrate the most vulnerable people

Since its creation in 2021, BSF Italia has promoted the education and socioprofessional integration of the most vulnerable people. For example, it has created educational and cultural spaces to help migrants integrate and rebuild their lives.



- ▶ Emergency micro-libraries in refugee centres in Turin to allow the people staying there to rest and plan for the future after the war and the trauma of exile.
- ▶ Multi-lingual micro-libraries to tackle the problem of children dropping out of the multicultural schools in the suburbs of Milan, Rome and Turin.
- ▶ The 'Check IT OUT' programme to help pupils in the fight against disinformation implemented in school libraries in four regions of the country.





In crisis contexts

In crisis contexts, there are usually numerous organisations providing assistance to meet people's vital needs – and this often lasts for several years. But too often, the intellectual dimension of human beings is overlooked. Vulnerable, or even traumatised, these people want to live rather than just survive.

This is why BSF creates welcoming and safe spaces where children and adults can escape for a while, express themselves and envisage a better future.

BURUNDI

'ÇA BOUGE À KAVUMU!': WHEN ART CHANGES THE WORLD!

As part of the photography project "Inside Out", created by the French artist JR, BSF organised an exhibition in Kavumu refugee camp, where the very first Ideas Box was installed in 2015. Fifty portraits of women, men and adolescents were hung on the walls of the camp library. The objective was to shed light on the people who too often remain unseen behind statistics.



AFGHANISTAN

ENCOURAGING THE SOCIAL INTEGRATION OF YOUNG PEOPLE

After the Taliban took control of Kabul in 2021, BSF and its partners set up one Ideas Box and nine Ideas Cube in a number of community centres in the country. Adolescents and young adults go to these places to develop new skills, learn about digital technology, express themselves and regain confidence.

MOROCCO

CREATING MICROLIBRARIES AFTER THE EARTHQUAKE

Following the earthquake that took place in the west of the country in September 2023, BSF and its partners will help to ensure that young people's education continues and will work towards the social and economic reintegration of the affected communities. With this objective in mind, two Ideas Box and twelve micro-libraries will soon be set up in the territories that have been most affected by the disaster.

DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO

HELPING SURVIVORS OF CONFLICT-RELATED SEXUAL VIOLENCE TO REBUILD THEIR LIVES

In Bukavu, in the province of South Kivu where there are violent armed groups, BSF has supported the work of the Maison Dorcas, created by Dr Mukwege's Panzi Foundation, which assists women and children who have been victims of sexual and psychological violence. An Ideas Cube and a library mean that there are more resources available to the mediators who provide survivors with social and educational activities.



UKRAINE

REBUILDING LIVES DESPITE THE WAR

In Ukraine, Poland, Moldavia, France, Belgium and Italy, BSF and its partners deploy Ideas Box and Ideas Cube libraries so that people who have been displaced by war can forget their daily ordeals for a while. In schools, reception centres and health centres, we create reassuring spaces where adults and children can relax, get to know the language and culture of their host country, inform themselves about their rights, find accommodation or find a job.

TURKEY

SUPPORTING DISPLACED PEOPLE AFTER THE EARTHQUAKES

 Fondation de France  Ideas Box

In February 2023, a series of earthquakes hit Turkey and Syria. With hundreds of thousands of people still living in 'container cities', BSF and the International Blue Crescent deployed an Ideas Box in Kirikhan in order supporting displaced people, preserve access to education for children and adolescents and contribute to the psychosocial support they receive.

ITALY

BOOKS THAT HELP TO SAVE LIVES AT SEA

 SOS Humanity  Books

BSF has installed a library of 160 books and games in Arabic, English and French on board the SOS Humanity's rescue ship which patrols the Mediterranean sea to save migrants from drowning. The crew organises a lot of cultural activities to help survivors overcome trauma, fight boredom and regain their humanity.

In developing regions

In many countries, **poverty, a lack of educational and cultural infrastructure, shortages of qualified teachers and disparities between rural and urban areas** are so many obstacles to gaining access to knowledge.

To overcome these, BSF works with its partners and local communities to **create dynamic and inclusive learning spaces and methods.**

BURUNDI

SUPPORTING ACADEMIC MOBILITY AND THE EMPLOYABILITY OF YOUNG PEOPLE

European Union Ideas Box & Kajou cards

In partnership with the Burundian Ministry of Education, BSF and the association Jimbere are reinforcing the university education system thanks to the deployment of 3 Ideas Box and 4 500 Kajou cards in the universities of Bujumbura, Gitega and Ngozi. These resources allow 5 000 students to learn languages and acquire general knowledge and digital skills to find a job or study abroad.

BURUNDI

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY FOR BURUNDIAN TEACHERS

French Development Agency Ideas Cube

BSF and its partners have deployed twenty Ideas Cube in a number of schools in the Gitega, Ngozi and Kirundo provinces to help 900 teachers. Working in partnership with the Burundian Ministry of Education, great care was taken in selecting resources that were inclusive for pupils with disabilities. Four Ideas Cube have also been installed in the *École Normale Supérieure* campuses in Bujumbura and Rumonge, where the teachers and researchers of the future are trained.



BURUNDI

IMPROVING ACCESS TO THE JUSTICE SYSTEM

Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands Ideas Cube & Kajou cards

BSF has helped the Burundian justice system by digitising legal texts and services to make the system faster and more independent. In partnership with Cordaid and Auxfin, 16 Ideas Cube and 3000 Kajou cards have improved the quality of services provided by legal bodies in the provinces of Makamba, Bujumbura and Gitega. Nine Ideas Cube also provide the public with legal information.

MADAGASCAR

EDUCATION IN ACTION IN RURAL AREAS

French Development Agency Ideas Cube & Kajou cards

In the Central Highlands of the Madagascar, BSF, IECD (*l'Institut Européen de Coopération et de Développement*) and the association PROMES are helping around a thousand junior high pupils to succeed. An Ideas Box and five Ideas Cube have been made available to the teachers and educators in several 'boarding schools for success' in Fianarantsoa, providing them with resources to help with their classes and their teaching methods.

IVORY COAST

HELPING YOUNG PEOPLE IN THEIR CAREER CHOICES

 Ivory Coast Ministry for the Promotion of Youth, Professional Integration and Civic Service

 Ideas Box

Through the "BiblioBox" project, BSF supports the social and professional integration of young people aged between 14 and 35 in several regions of the country. Fourteen Ideas Box have been deployed in civic service centres for young people. Information about jobs and training courses help them to define their career plans. These mobile multimedia libraries also have numerous resources on gender equality, terrorism prevention, media literacy and human rights.

LEBANON

INCREASING THE AUTONOMY OF LOCAL AND REFUGEE POPULATIONS

 French Development Agency

 Ideas Box

In the context of an unprecedented economic and political crisis, BSF and the association Amel are improving access to education and increasing cohesion between local and refugee populations. Three Ideas Box, respectively in Beirut, Khiam and Kamed el-Loz, have helped users to regain self-confidence, find training courses or jobs, and overcome the challenges they face. This is part of a bigger project by BSF which aims to assist refugee, displaced, returnee and host populations in three countries: Lebanon, Iraq and Burundi.



MOLDAVIA

COPING WITH NATURAL AND MAN-MADE DISASTERS

BSF, Acted and REACH are training local authorities, civil society organisations and communities to cope with natural and man-made disasters. In the rural region of Anenii Noi, 1 Ideas Box, 10 Ideas Cube and 2 000 Kajou cards provide access to numerous resources on subjects such as the protection of women and girls or sustainable agriculture.

Despite the coup d'état in the summer of 2023, BSF and its partners are working to maintain access to quality education for young children in the Madaoua department on the Nigerian border. With this objective in mind, three Ideas Cube and 75 Kajou cards have been deployed in primary schools.

In collaboration with the Senegalese Ministry of Education, BSF has deployed 70 Ideas Cube and 700 Kajou cards in primary schools in the Kédougou region. The educational and digital contents have been adapted to the country's school syllabus thus helping 500 teachers to develop their lessons and teaching methods to reduce the number of children dropping out of school.


The central role of the project's impact assessment methodology

Needs assessment

Interviews were carried out with pupils and teachers in order to understand the local context, identify the issues at stake, and the specific needs in terms of resources and mediation.

Impact assessment

Throughout the project, a comparative impact assessment was carried out between the 70 beneficiary schools and 70 other schools in order to quantify the pupils' success and the reduction in school drop outs and inequality between girls and boys.



Selection and creation of content

The BSF teams selected and created made-to-measure content in French, Wolof, Serer and Pulaar to meet the needs of the beneficiaries, in accordance with the project objectives as established with the operating partners.

Training and support

Teachers were trained by BSF to use these tools and in related mediation techniques: facilitating activities, transmitting information, etc. These teachers then share their new skills with their colleagues.



To promote equal opportunities

Universal access to knowledge is also a struggle in France. There is an exceptionally dense network of libraries, which contribute to establishing equal opportunities through the discoveries and encounters they allow. But despite this, access remains difficult for too many people, and others feel that libraries are not for them. BSF and its partners therefore contribute to making them accessible to all and distribute numerous teaching resources and tools.

Books & Games

From metropolitan France to the overseas territories, BSF and the Fondation Cultura support the creation of micro-libraries to rebuild social ties around books and culture. These "microbiblis" are run by associations, shops, social and educational bodies or reading enthusiasts who are selected via a bi-annual call for projects. Those who are selected receive around a thousand books and training in how to run their micro-library. Far from competing with public libraries, on the contrary, these create synergy with local cultural institutions to promote reading among a wider audience.

Books

At the end of the school year in 2023, BSF gave rucksacks full of books to thousands of pupils in the Paris, Amiens, Aix-Marseille and Créteil areas who had recently arrived in France. Each bag contained books selected by our staff and other pupils of the same age to spark an interest in reading and help them learn French and about France. Throughout the year, the classes learn about solidarity and other cultures through reading and writing, and events with authors and illustrators.

Ideas Box

Several local authorities in France have acquired Ideas Box to help those whose access to culture is limited by economic, social or symbolic barriers, particularly young people from working class neighbourhoods. They have helped multimedia centres and youth, social and educational services in Amiens, Marseille and the agglomeration of Grand Narbonne, for example, to provide a broader selection of books and to help these people find out about the resources and services that are available to them.


[Environmental, social and governance issues](#) therefore occupy an increasingly significant place in our strategic reflection and day-to-day activities.

Reducing our carbon footprint is a daily concern

"As is the case throughout the humanitarian sector, reducing the carbon footprint of BSF's activities is a constant concern, particularly with regard to how our logistics circuits are organised. We have already taken measures to promote local and regional purchasing, to reduce the distances covered by our service providers and to prioritise the purchasing of energy efficient and environmentally friendly electronic equipment. There are regular awareness-raising sessions about good practices to reduce the consumption of electricity and water and also in relation to waste production and recycling. There is a huge but unavoidable task ahead of us to accurately evaluate our impact, establish realistic alternatives and implement these".



A word from the Treasurer

“Ahead of schedule in its development plan, BSF has recorded a 24% increase in its resources in 2023 compared with 2022”.

2023 was the first year of the implementation of the Horizon 2030 strategy which aims to triple BSF’s impact and operational volume by 2030 focusing on three main areas: geographic expansion, improving project quality and reinforcing advocacy capacity.

The strategy was financed to the value of €1.95M via the issue of Associative Securities in 2022 in order to strengthen our own funds and enable us to make significant investments. The financial plan adopted at the Annual General Meeting projected two years of deficit in 2023 and 2024 in order to make the initial investments necessary for our development. The following years (from 2025 to 2030) should enable us to generate positive results in order to repay the Associative Securities at the end of a 7-year period.

Ahead of schedule in its development plan, BSF has recorded a 24% increase in its resources in 2023 compared with 2022, reaching €12.2M, which exceeds the initial forecasts (€10.7M).


This growth is mainly due to a 69% increase in operating grants, which reflects the relevance and alignment of BSF’s approaches with needs on the ground. The association’s income profile is diversified, with financial contributions and funds from the public still strong, while sales of goods and services are down slightly following the creation of a subsidiary for the book sales business. Operating expenses also rose by 26% to €12.5M, mainly due to operational expansion and significant investment in human resources.

The strong growth in resources has resulted in a result of -€317k, much better than that forecast in the H2030 financial plan (-€630k initially forecast).


This positive momentum should continue in 2024, with resources continuing to rise. This will be a crucial year if we are to achieve financial equilibrium in 2025, with particular attention being paid to cash management, accountability to donors and optimising the funds allocated to projects.

BSF’s management has taken these issues on board, and we are confident that the organisation will continue to grow in a sound and responsible manner over the coming years.


→ Distribution of activities
